SALT, EDWARD, SR - Clermont Co

B Birmingham, Yorkshire, England; d 1812, Franklin Twp, Clermont Co, O. His name is listed as Revolutionary Soldr in Thirey and Mitchell's Hist of Clermont Co, O, p 135. Soldr m an Irish lady and was disinherited by his father. He and his bride came to America ca 1750, settling in Berkeley Co, Va; in 1790 moved from Suffolk Co, Va to Crab Orchard, Ky: then crossed Ohio River at mouth of Bullskin Creek (where settlement of Rural now stands) he built a cabin in 1796 and operated a ferry until he died. Children: John d 10-9-1859, ae 76y Im 29d, (bur Old Calvary Cem, Washington Twp, Clermont Co, O.) m, 1st, 1809, to Nancy Donovan, b 1789. Haverdegrass, Md, moved to Bracken Co, Ky, 1792, d 1-5-1845, ae 56y 11m 1d, dau of Daniel and Elizabeth Donovan, m, 2nd, Nancy Clarke; Edward, Jr m Priscilla Conrey, dau of Revolutionary Soldr, John Conrey; Innocent m William Frazier; Nellie m John Wharton: Betsey m --? SAMS (not Same), JONAS - Brown Co

B 11-18-1756, Pa; bur Sardinia, O - Eagle Twp, Brown Co. In Va Mil. Also with Col Crawford at his defeat 1782. Soldr came from Westmoreland Co, Pa to Ky and then to O in 1803. Two years later, he settled on the headwaters of Brush Creek. in Eagle Twp. Sams was an old Indian fighter and hunter and expert woodsman thoroughly familiar with frontier life. He was with Col Crawford at his defeat and capture near the Wyandot village in 1782 and experienced the horrors of that fearful retreat. He says that he and his bro, Jonathan Sams, joined Crawford's men at the Mingo Bottoms and that after the defeat of Crawford, he and 7 others started for the fort at Wheeling, but that after a perilous journey of 10 days, 4 of which they were closely pursued by Indians, only he and 2 of his companions arrived at the point of destination, the others having been killed by their pursuers.
