FESTIVAL HELPERS

Volunteer Stewards. Information Officers, Health and Safety and Security attendants are all Wanted for the Saltaire Festival between 10th and 20th September 2009. Volunteers will be required to work on the Finale Weekend (Sept 18th-20th) and other times if they are really keen to support this ambitious two week programme of art trails, dramatic performances, guided walks, street entertainment, markets and live music. Briefings are to take place on Sept 9th at 6pm. Venue to be confirmed.

Saltaire Methodist Church will maintain its reputation as a venue for outstanding works of art during the seventh Saltaire Festival which takes place this month.

The church itself, on Saltaire Road, hosts an exhibition of religious work, Painted Prayers and Healing Waters by Caroline Jariwala. Downstairs in the church hall, Airewaves, presented by Saltaire Methodist Art Group with the support of Salts Mill, features among other paintings an intriguing 8x12ft work Pat Dewhirst. bv depicting a canal boat in red with black and white buildings behind – and "moveable people" (one on a bicycle) in front.

Both exhibitons are open on Saturdays 12th & 19th from 10am and Sundays 13th & 20th from noon until 4.30pm (Airewaves) and 5pm (Prayers). Admission to both shows is free.

The church will also be participating in the famous Saltaire Arts Trail, which this year includes exhibitions, by textile practioners, in the Mill, the screening of six classic films and a Mini Arts Trail for children, in addition to the already well established and hugely popular Open Houses Meanwhile, project. music and literature galore is promised at the United Reformed Church down at the bottom of Victoria Road. BAND LOOKING FORWARD TO FIRST HOME GIG

On September 19th, Hammonds Saltaire Band, formerly known as YBS, will be giving a concert in Victoria Hall, their first in the Village since changing their name. Chairman John Myles told the Sentinel, "We are all extremely excited at the prospect of playing in our 'first' concert at Saltaire. The welcome given to us by many people associated with the history of the Village has been quite tremendous and the interest shown to date in the band has made all of us very proud to be involved in the area." The concert, co-ordinated by Kate Breeze, and promising an "excellent" programme devised by Musical Director Morgan Griffiths, will commence at 7.30pm. There will be further opportunities to hear the band at the United Reformed Church on Saturday, November 28th and at the inauguration of the new bandstand as part of Roberts Park renovation at Easter. 2010.

ACQUISITIONS FOR ARCHIVE

One of the new acquisitions on display for over two hundred visitors to the recent Saltaire Archive Exhibition was a silver handled walking cane with the inscription: "Presented by the members of Saltaire Brass Band, Sir Titus Salt and Sons and Company, to Joseph Scott, military outfitter, for the efficient manner in which he executed the uniform dress of the band. Made by Joseph Paley, Bandmaster. Dated 24th May, 1879." - which had been discovered by chance by Elaine and Karl Moring in the airing cupboard of their home at Kettering, Northamptonshire! On Saturday, July 25th the Morings were met at the Shipley College Resource Centre by a small group which included John Myles, Chairman of the Band, and Julie Woodward and Sandi Moore from the Centre, and very generously handed it over to the Archive.

On separate occasions, Peter Randall donated a book detailing the sale in 1911 of a number of local properties owned by the Earl of Rosse, and Pauline contributed the results of her extensive Sleight research into the ministry of the erstwhile local Congregational Church. Resource Centre staff Julie and Sandi once again set up the exhibits in addition to their usual workload, just as they maintain the Archive throughout the year, and members of the Saltaire History Club were on hand at every session this year to talk to visitors and explain what was on offer. Over thirty people had volunteered to read, half an hour at a time each but many

TOURIST INFO A PRIORITY FOR VILLAGE SOCIETY

Tourist information is the main priority for the Saltaire Village Society (SVS), says Chair Rob Martin. Following the failure of a proposed partnership with Shipley College to set up an information point, a working group, including SVS and Council officers, has been set up by the Saltaire Project Team (SPT) to address the problem. Another positive outcome of the SPT meeting in July was that Cllr. Greaves (Chair) instigated enforcement action for the removal of the telegraph pole in Albert Terrace at the bottom of Fanny Street. "Even action if this is unsuccessful it may serve to make 'Openreach' go through the proper procedure before erecting another pole in the World Heritage Site", said Mr. Martin. The issue of unsightly wheelie bins filling the backs of Saltaire streets was also discussed by the Project Team and ways of minimising this problem such as smaller bins (which are available by request) and encouraging people to keep their bin in their yard were ideas put forward.
